ATHENIAN GOUDEN AGE

ATHENS emerged as leading Greek polis

- PERICLES emerged as the leading Athenian politician
 - ☐ Used \$\$ from DELIAN LEAGUE to achieve goals

1)Expand DEMOCRACY

- began paying office holders
- 2)Expand Athenian Empire
 - **COLONIES**
 - * NAVY
- 3)Rebuild // Beautify Athens
 - WALLS of Pireaus
 - PARTHENON



PELOPONNESIAN WAR

REASONS FOR WAR

- 1)Sparta felt "threatened" and "distrusted" the growing power and actions of Athens
 - walls
 - □ navy
 - ☐ Delian League ("Athenian Empire")
- Sparta created the "PELOPONNESIAN LEAGUE" to challenge the Delian League
 - "rival alliances" create "powder kegs"

2)Athenian Arrogance

PELOPONNESIANWAR

ATHENIAN PROBLEMS

- 1)430 BC **PLAGUE** hit Athens
 - □1/3 of people died including Pericles
 - ☐ last capable ruler of Athens
- 2)415 BC Athenian NAVY defeated
- 3)Athens moving towards "Mob Rule"
- 404 BC Athens surrenders to Sparta
 - **□** Athens destroyed
 - □ protective walls torn down
 - **BEND OF ATHENIAN DEMOCRACY**

PELOPONNESIANWAR

Sparta began to abusing its power and soon other city-states began rebelling against Sparta

By 350 BC Greece was in a state of "Anarchy"

"IN FIGHTING" WEAKENED GREECE PREVENTING IT FROM BEING ABLE TO UNITE AND PROTECT ITSELF

RISE OF MACEDONIA

PHILIP II

338 BC **Battle of Chaeronea**

☐ defeated Greeks and took control of Greece

336 BC Philip II was assassinated

☐ Alexander (son) took control

ALEXANDER THE GREAT

- **otutored by ARISTOTLE**
 - carried copy of "Iliad"
- ogreat strategist, fought along side soldiers, paid soldiers

RISE OF MACEDONIA

- 331 BC Battle of Guagamela
 - **□** gained control of western Persian Empire
- 326 BC Alexander's soldiers threatened "MUTINY"
- 323 BC Alexander died
 - **■** EMPIRE STRETCHED OVER 3000 MILES

LEGACY OF ALEXANDER THE GREAT

- **✓ NEVER LOST A BATTLE**
- ✓ spread of **HELLENISM** (Hellene = Greek)
 - politics, law, literature, philosophy, religion, and art
- ✓ encouraged education
