AGE OF ABSOLUTISM

Since Middle Ages, the power of European Monarchs had been limited by the Church and/or Feudalism (power of lords), BUT gradually monarchs increased their power:

- 1. Weakening Feudal System
 - a. Black Death
 - i. reducing power of lords
 - ii. weakened Church because Church did not have answers to reasons for or solutions to the plague
- 2. Protestant Reformation weakened the power of the Church over leaders
- 3. Religious Wars
 - a. Many viewed Absolute Monarchs as the solution
 - i. Many Europeans were happy to give up power for peace and safety
 - ii. Establish a Bureaucracy with power over all parts of society which answered only to the King
- 4. **Wealth** (Gold/Silver) from exploration (New World) went directly to monarchs

RISE OF SPANISH ABSOLUTISM

Spain became Europe's 1st modern country

- 1479 **Ferdinand and Isabella**
 - Unified Spain
 - Inquisition
 - Exploration
 - Christopher Columbus

1516 Charles V

- Became also emperor of HRE
- Increased gold/silver coming into Spain

1556 **Philip II** – King of Spain – "The Most Catholic King"

- son of Charles V (HRE)
- ruled 42 years
- **Escorial** palace
- brought Spain into "Siglo de Oro" = "Golden Century"
 - El Greco
 - Cervantes "Don Quixote"
 - Cervantes began writing while in prison
 - Obsessed with the chivalrous ideals in books he has read, he decides to take up his lance and sword to defend the helpless and destroy the wicked
 - fights windmills that he imagines to be giants
- Absolute Monarch
 - "DIVINE RIGHT OF KINGS"
 - Jacques-Benigne Bousset right to rule came from God and should be obeyed absolutely
 - o opposition to a monarch is viewed as "sin"
 - ALLOWED MONARCHS TO ESTABLISH ABSOLUTISM

Tools for Expanding Power

- **1)Marriage** -4x for alliances and pacify enemies
 - Maria alliances w/ Portugal
 - Mary Tudor alliances w/ England
 - Elizabeth Valois alliances w/ France
 - Anna alliances w/ Austria

???What is problem w/ expanding power through marriage???

- 2) War "When Spain Moves, the Whole World Moves"
 - strong military

3)Support of Catholic Church

- Inquisition
 - Protestants
 - Marranos
 - Jews converted to Christianity
 - Moriscos Muslims converted to Christianity
- **Battle of Lepanto** (1571) defeated Turks [Muslims]

4)Wealth [Silver/Gold]

DECLINE OF SPAIN'S POWER

- 1. 1588 Defeat of Spanish Armada to England
 - i. Damaged Spanish pride and confidence
- 2. Lack of Strong leadership after Philip II
- 3. Economic Problems
 - a. Costly wars
 - b. Influx of gold/silver caused Spain to
 - i. neglect farming
 - ii. neglect industry
 - iii. spend too much money
 - c. Gold/silver mines gradually declined and Spain never built a strong "infrastructure"
 - d. Inquisition caused Jews/Muslims to flee and many were skilled workers
 - e. Weakening of navy to compete for colonies
 - f. Revolt by Spanish wanting greater freedoms
